## DUNLAP PREPARES FOR PATRIOTIC 4TH CELEBRATION

Longtime community favorites and a high-energy concert are set to headline this year's Dunlap Fourth of July celebration, as organizers plan an expanded event in honor of the nation's 250th anniversary.

The Dunlap Fourth of July Committee has spent months preparing festivities that blend tradition with new excitement. Committee Chair Justin Schaben said the milestone anniversary inspired organizers to elevate the celebration.

"With this being the 250th anniversary of our nation, we felt it was important to make this year's celebration bigger and more memorable than ever," Schaben said. "It's a special moment in American history, and we want our community to come together to celebrate it in a meaningful and fun way."

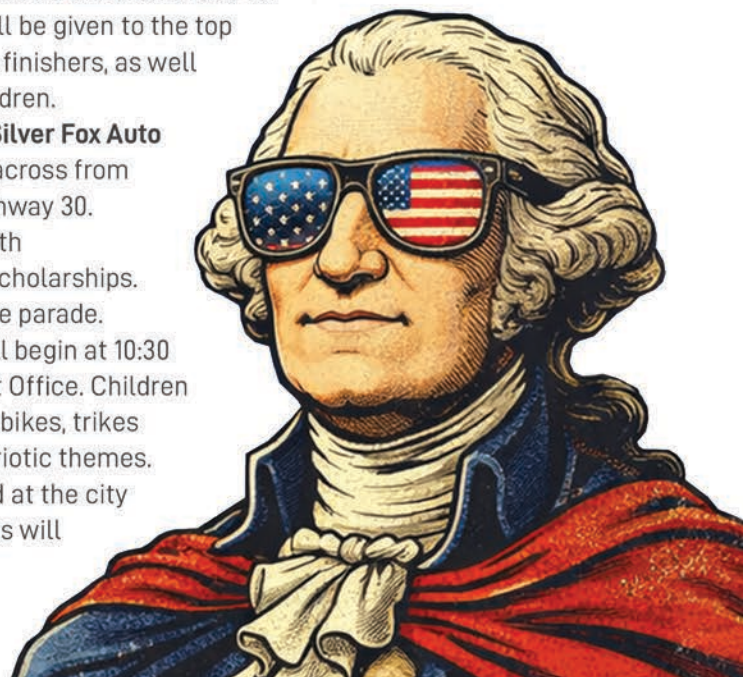
The national semiquincentennial also inspired this year's **parade theme, "Founding Fathers on Parade."** Organizers encourage participants to embrace the theme with colonial-era costumes, including powdered wigs and waistcoats.

Festivities begin July 3 with the **Dunlap Golf Course's annual four-person, nine-hole best ball tournament.** Registration opens at 3 p.m., with tee time set for 4 p.m. That evening, the Dunlap United Methodist Church will host its **annual ice cream social** from 5 to 7 p.m., offering treats for a freewill donation. The celebration continues with the **Dog House Bar & Grill street dance** at 8 p.m., featuring live music by Secret Weapon.

Activities resume the morning of July 4 with the annual **Fun Run and Walk**, a three-mile course beginning and ending at the Dunlap City Park. This event is for all ages, and even includes a children's race for ages 2 to 10. Awards will be given to the top three male and female finishers, as well as all participating children.

Registration for the **Silver Fox Auto Show** begins at 8 a.m. across from Town & Country on Highway 30. Participation is free, with donations supporting scholarships. The show will follow the parade.

The **kiddie parade** will begin at 10:30 a.m. at the Dunlap Post Office. Children are invited to decorate bikes, trikes and ride-on toys in patriotic themes. The short route will end at the city park, where participants will receive prizes.



The **main parade** begins at 11 a.m., with lineup at the 4 County Fairgrounds. No preregistration is required. Organizers encourage a wide variety of entries, including floats, farm equipment and classic cars. Water balloons and similar items are not permitted.

Following the parade, **games and activities** will take place from noon to 3 p.m. in the city park. Wristbands for inflatables and activities are \$15. Additional amenities include pickleball and basketball courts, along with yard games sponsored by the Dunlap American Legion Post 224.

One of the day's most anticipated traditions, **Pig Poop Bingo**, will return once again. The event, revived in recent years by Austin McDonald, has become a highlight for attendees. McDonald, a longtime organizer, said the game brings back fond memories.

"I have fond Fourth of July memories of going to the park after the parade in my youth," McDonald said. "Families enjoying the activities and games — one of my favorites was Pig Poop Bingo. As a young boy, everything seemed bigger. There was a huge, paneled area with a pig surrounded by people awaiting the results and their winnings. I'm so happy we've been able to bring it back for new generations to enjoy."

Squares for the game are available in advance and the day of the event for \$20 each, with only 100 squares sold. A pig will be released into a marked grid at the city park, and the winning square is determined when the pig makes its mark. The winner will receive a \$500 cash prize.

Adding to this year's celebration, Community Bank is marking its 100th anniversary by sponsoring a **live concert in the park**. The band Love Scar will perform from 1 to 2:30 p.m., playing classic rock hits from the 1970s and 1980s.

"We're excited to partner with Community Bank to bring live music into the park," Schaben said. "Love Scar puts on a great show, and it's the perfect way for families and friends to relax, enjoy the afternoon and celebrate together."

Additional attractions include the **Dunlap swimming pool**, open from 1 to 3 p.m., and the **Dunlap Golf Course**, which will be open throughout the day.

The celebration will conclude with a **fireworks display** at dusk at Pleasant View Park, funded by the City of Dunlap and organized by the Dunlap Fire Department.

## DUNLAP PREPARES TO WELCOME THOUSANDS FOR RAGBRAI STOP JULY 19

With less than one month remaining until thousands of bicyclists roll through town, the Dunlap RAGBRAI Committee continues working to finalize plans for one of the largest single-day events in the community's history.

Committee members estimate approximately 15,000 riders and visitors could pass through Dunlap on Sunday, July 19, as part of the annual Register's Annual Great Bicycle Ride Across Iowa, commonly known as RAGBRAI.

Dunlap's theme, "We Put the AG in RAGBRAI," celebrates Dunlap's deep agricultural roots and the community's role as a hub of Iowa farm country.

"Hosting RAGBRAI isn't like planning a normal community event," Jill Schaben, RAGBRAI Committee Chair said. "It feels like we're pulling a million levers at once. Between vendors, volunteers, entertainment, signage, sanitation, traffic control and hospitality, there are countless details that have to come together at exactly the right time."

The committee's goal is not to generate profits, but rather to create an opportunity for local businesses, nonprofits and community organizations to benefit from the influx of visitors while introducing thousands of people to Dunlap.

"The committee is operating under a tight budget and our objective is simply to break even," Schaben said. "The real return on investment comes from supporting our local businesses, helping community organizations raise funds and putting Dunlap on display for thousands of people who may be visiting for the first time."

Planning efforts have focused heavily on infrastructure and visitor amenities. Organizers have budgeted for portable restrooms, dumpsters, trash receptacles, picnic tables, signage and other necessities designed to encourage riders to stop, stay and explore the community.

"If visitors can't easily find what they need, they'll simply move on to the next town," Schaben said. "Everything we're doing is intended to create a positive experience that benefits the entire community."

One of the most visible planning decisions has been the selection of the rider route through town. Committee members emphasized that the route was developed through extensive coordination among RAGBRAI officials, the Iowa Department of Transportation, the Iowa State Patrol and local law enforcement agencies. Safety remained the primary consideration throughout the planning process.

Organizers said the chosen route helps keep cyclists off U.S. Highway 30 while safely directing riders into the heart of the community festival area.

"The route wasn't selected arbitrarily," Schaben said. "It was developed through a thoughtful process involving transportation and public safety professionals. The route allows riders to safely enter town while ensuring they experience the community and businesses that have worked so hard to prepare for this event."

The primary festival area will encompass the first two blocks of Iowa Avenue east of Highway 30 and from there extend one block north and south along Seventh Street.

Visitors can expect numerous food vendors offering both local favorites and cuisines from outside the area. Organizers also anticipate a selection of community organizations and attractions throughout the festival footprint.

A highlight of the day will be Dunlap's Avenue of Tractors, a display celebrating the agricultural heritage that inspired this year's theme. Tractor owners are encouraged to line their tractors up along the north side of the school on Iowa Ave. Additional entertainment will include music throughout the day, featuring popular RAGBRAI favorite DJ Dave.

The committee's Hospitality Team also promises several surprises designed specifically for riders and visitors.

"We've got some exciting things planned that we aren't quite ready to reveal yet," Schaben said. "People should keep watching the Dunlap RAGBRAI Facebook page for announcements and updates."

Residents should expect significant traffic impacts throughout the day. Numerous streets will be barricaded and parking restrictions will be implemented in areas surrounding the festival. Additional information regarding road closures, parking and traffic flow will be released as the event approaches.

Organizers encourage residents to plan ahead and allow additional travel time on July 19.

The majority of riders are expected to begin arriving during the mid-morning hours. Activity will remain heavy through early afternoon, with most cyclists expected to depart by approximately 3 p.m.

Despite months of planning already completed, organizers say volunteers remain one of the community's greatest needs.

Volunteer opportunities include staffing information booths, assisting with setup and cleanup, helping direct visitors and supporting various festival operations throughout the day.

"An event of this size simply doesn't happen without volunteers," Schaben said. "We're incredibly grateful for everyone who has already stepped forward to help, and we're still looking for additional people willing to donate a few hours of their time."

Committee members acknowledged that hosting thousands of visitors in a community the size of Dunlap presents challenges, but said the opportunity is well worth the effort.

"This is one of the biggest opportunities our community will ever have to showcase itself," Schaben said. "The planning timeline is short, the undertaking is enormous and the responsibility is significant. But this committee takes that responsibility seriously, and we're excited to welcome riders to Dunlap."

## PARK IMPROVEMENTS CONTINUE TO ENHANCE RECREATION OPPORTUNITIES IN DUNLAP

Recreation opportunities continue to grow in Dunlap as recent improvements at both Dunlap City Park and Pleasant View Park provide new amenities for residents and visitors to enjoy.

The newest addition is an independent pickleball court at Dunlap City Park. The project builds upon the growing popularity of pickleball in the community and expands recreational opportunities for players of all ages.

Several years ago, the Dunlap Grants Committee worked to create a dual-purpose court by adding pickleball lines and a movable net to the existing basketball court. The shared space quickly proved successful.

"At times, we would see two games of basketball taking place — one at each hoop — while a pickleball game was happening right in the middle of the court," said Jill Schaben of the Dunlap Grants Committee. "That's a good problem to have. It showed us there was enough interest in both activities to justify creating a dedicated space for pickleball."



Recognizing the need for additional court space, the Dunlap Grants Committee sought and received funding from the Harrison County Community Foundation to construct a new standalone pickleball court.

The project required the removal of an aging and unsafe ticket booth shelter house by City of Dunlap employees. A new concrete pad was then poured with assistance from Greg Brasel and his crew. Funding for the court's polymeric surface was provided through the Dean J. King Foundation, while volunteers Walter Schaben and Trevor Biley assembled and installed the court's net system.

Improvements have also recently been completed at Pleasant View Park, where city employees installed a new swing set for children and families to enjoy. The project was made possible through funding provided by the Harrison County Community Foundation and the Dean J. King Foundation.

The recent projects are part of a broader effort to improve Dunlap's parks and recreational facilities. Over the past four years, significant investments have been made in both parks, resulting in enhanced amenities, improved accessibility and expanded recreational opportunities for residents.

"These projects demonstrate what can happen when community organizations, local volunteers, city staff and funding partners work together," Schaben said. "We've seen tremendous progress in both parks over the past several years, and we're excited about the additional improvements that are still being planned for the future."

## BUSINESS PARTNER PROGRAM CONNECTS STUDENTS WITH COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENTS

Students in Mrs. Hartwig's fourth-grade classroom recently had the opportunity to learn about community development firsthand through the Boyer Valley Elementary Business Partner Program.

As part of the program, DCDC Executive Director Jill Schaben visited the classroom twice to discuss community improvements, volunteerism and the many ways residents can make a difference in their hometown.

During the classroom visits, students reviewed photographs of public spaces throughout Dunlap and were challenged to identify opportunities for improvement. The activity encouraged students to think critically about their community and consider how projects, volunteers and partnerships can help shape public spaces.

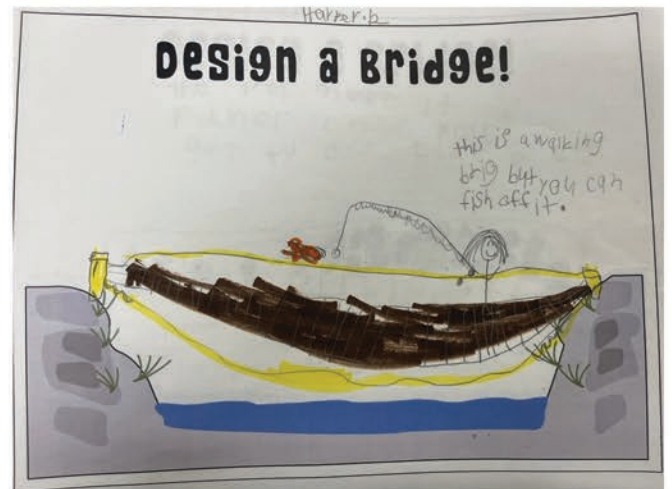
Each student also proposed a design for replacing two derelict pedestrian bridges in the Dunlap community.

The learning experience concluded with a field trip to Pleasant View Park, where students were able to see several community improvement projects in action.

While at the park, students explored Dunlap's recently improved disc golf course, which was enhanced through grant funding and city labor. The group also walked the Dunlap StoryWalk, a literacy-focused attraction made possible through local fundraising efforts and volunteer support. Students finished their visit enjoying the playground, which was installed in 2022 through grant funding and the efforts of numerous community volunteers.

Schaben said the Business Partner Program provides a valuable opportunity to help students understand how community projects come together and how local residents can play a role in creating positive change.

The Boyer Valley Elementary Business Partner Program connects local businesses, organizations and community leaders with students to provide real-world learning experiences and strengthen connections between the classroom and the community.

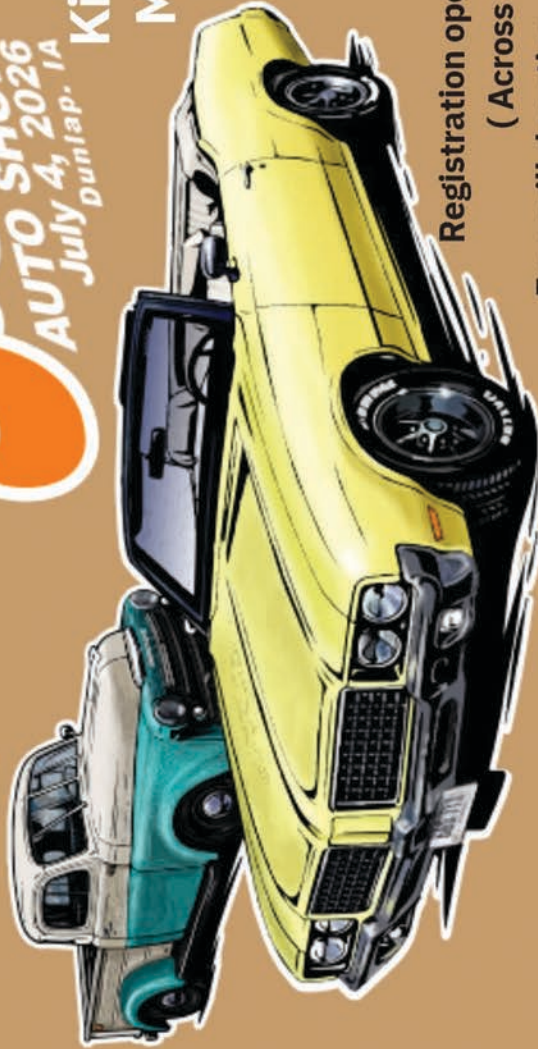

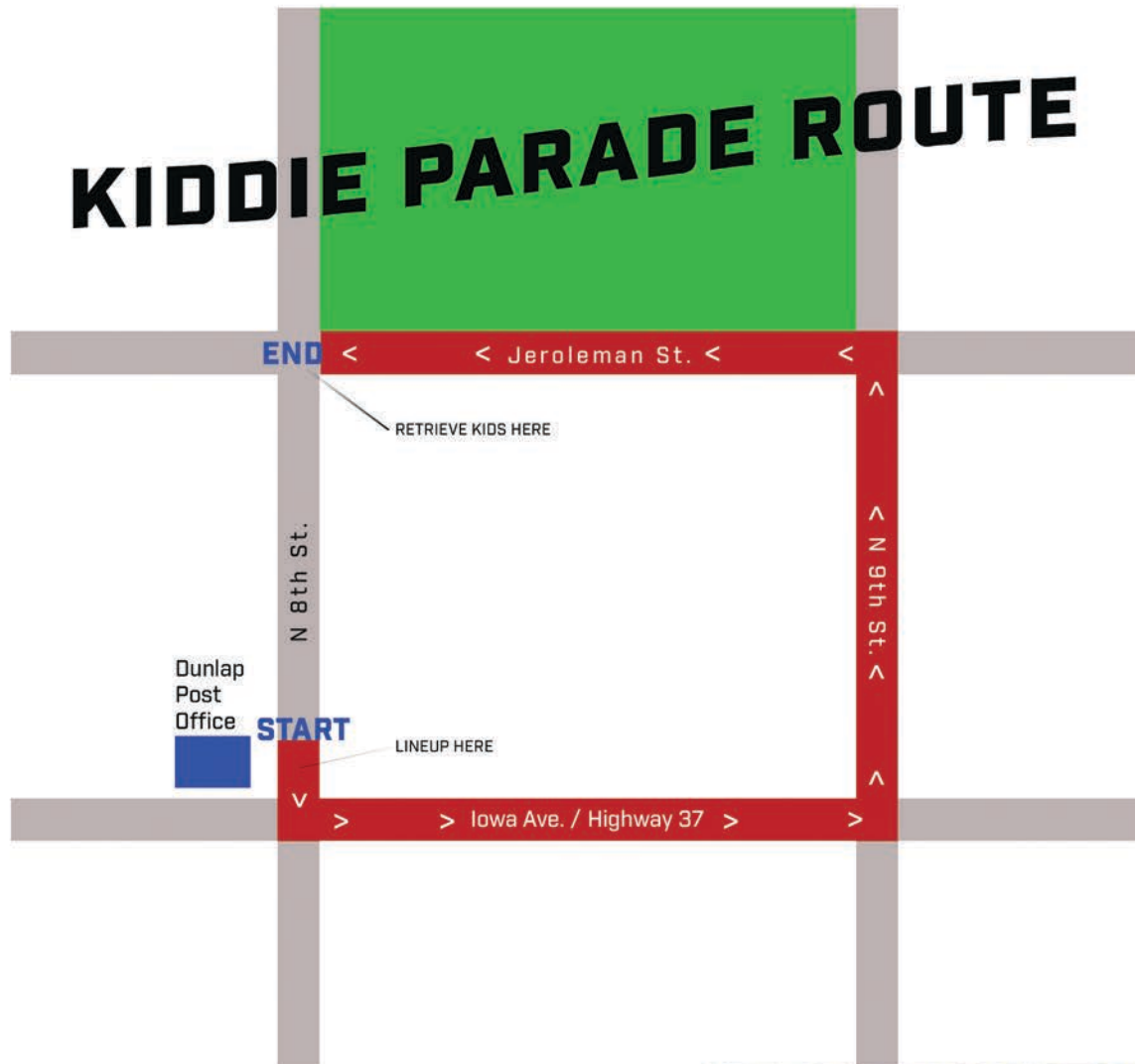
